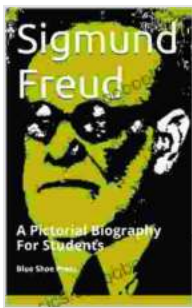

Early Life

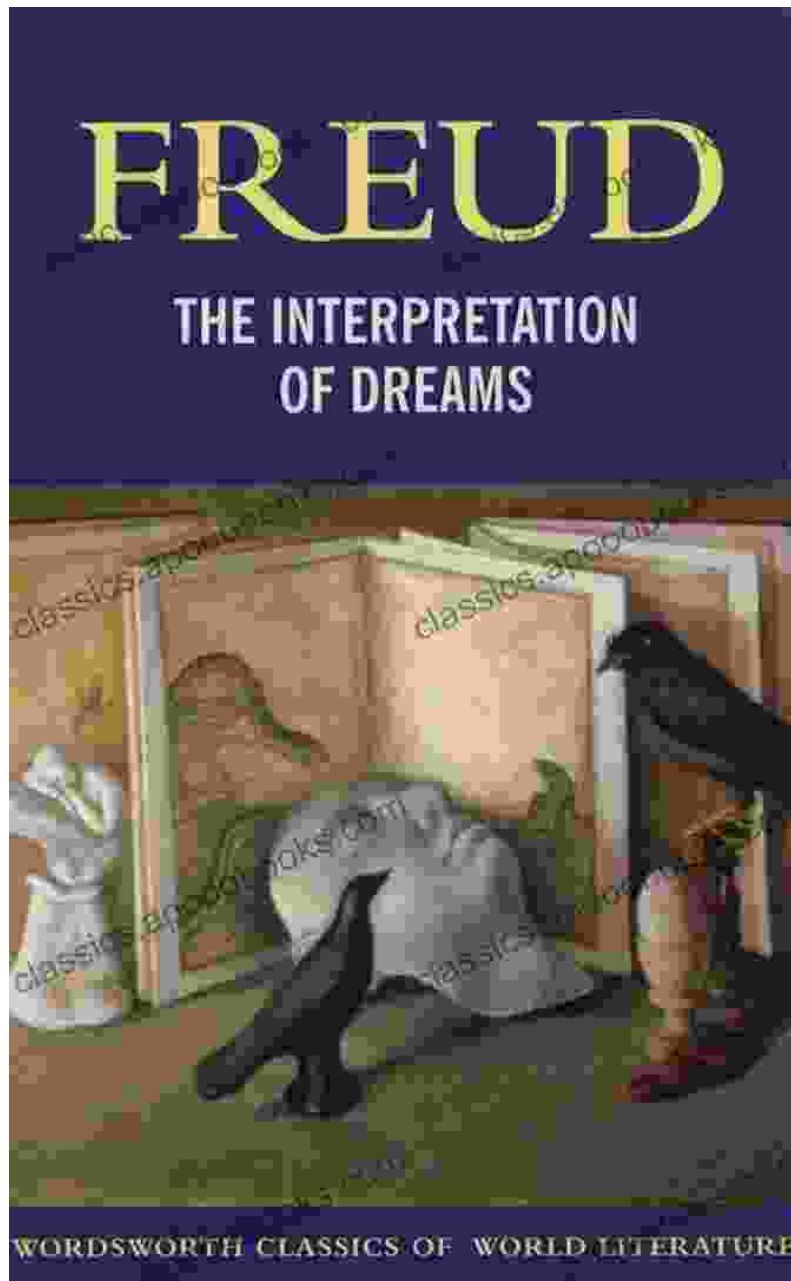

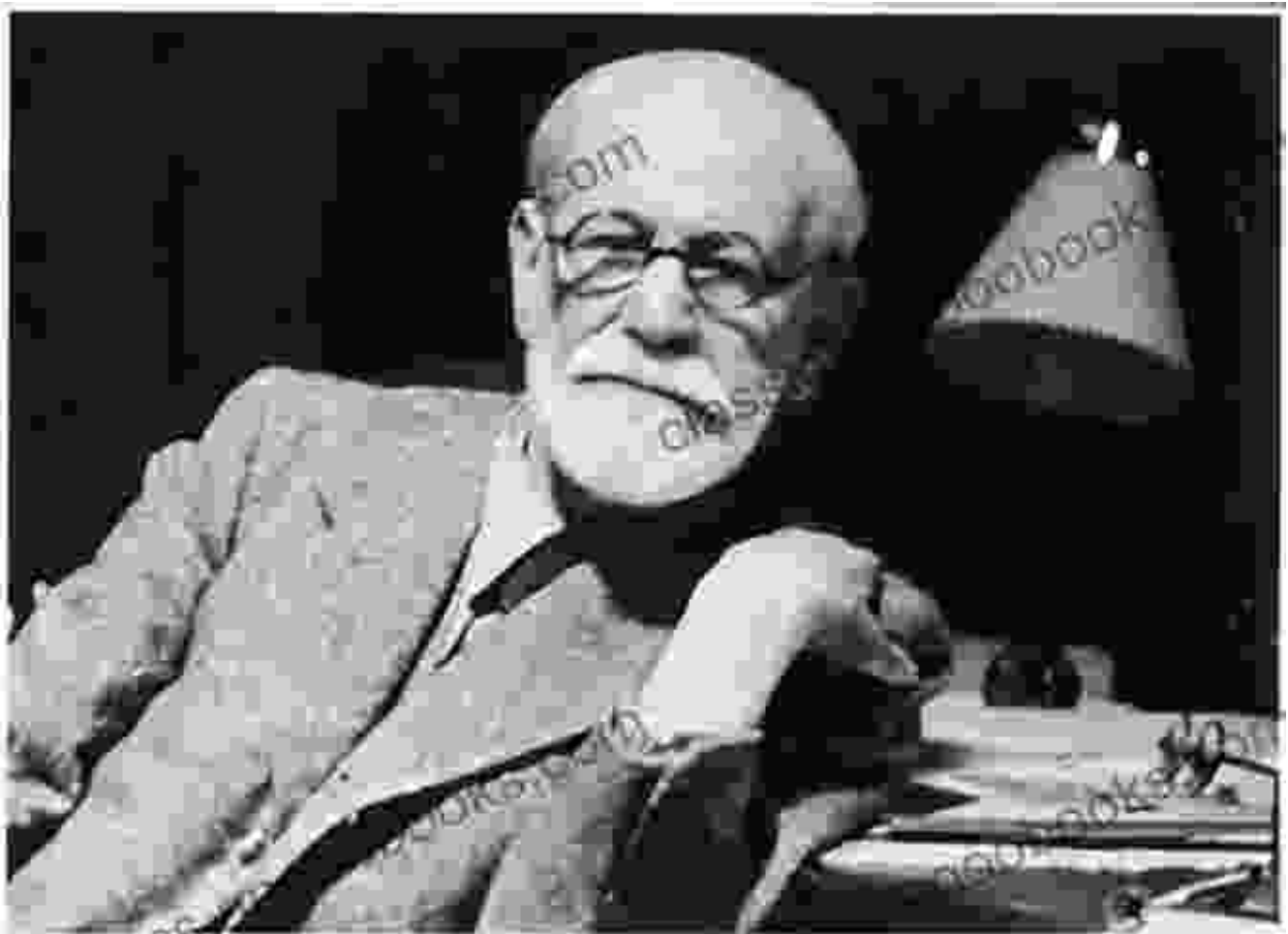

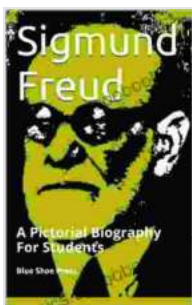
